



OMG I cannot believe that we are almost 3 years into the creation of this magazine and we are going digital.


So to celebrate the first digital cover we are celebrating our very own Ceo Vonnie of Big Boys Are Cute which is a brand that I fully support.

We're not born with insecurities! Society's fucked up beauty standards cause us to compare & you are perfect just how you are.


XLTM: So recently you moved what sparked the change?
